<p>Chapter 2 Knowing Yourself as a Learner: Section 2.6 Applying What You Know about Learning</p>	<p>The last line of the quote reads "...sitting towards the front of the classroom limits the tendency to be on check my phone" Unless this was inserted verbatim from the student and the typo was intentional by the authors, it should instead be "the tendency to check on my phone" or "the tendency to be on my phone" though I would suggest the former. <p>Chapter 5 Reading and Notetaking: Section 5.3 Taking Notes</p>	<p>Quote: "You can play with different types of notetaking suggestions and find the method(s) you like best, but once you find what works for you, stick with it. You will become more efficient with the method the more you use it, and your notetaking, review, and test prep will become, if not easier, certainly more organized, which can delete decrease your anxiety."
